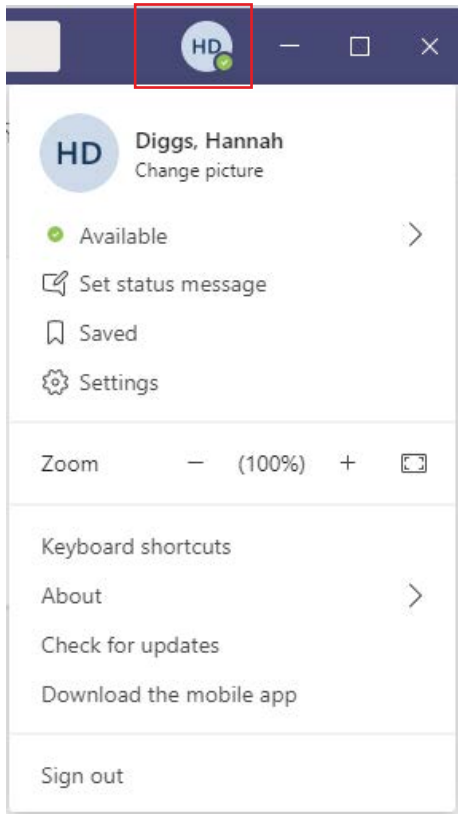
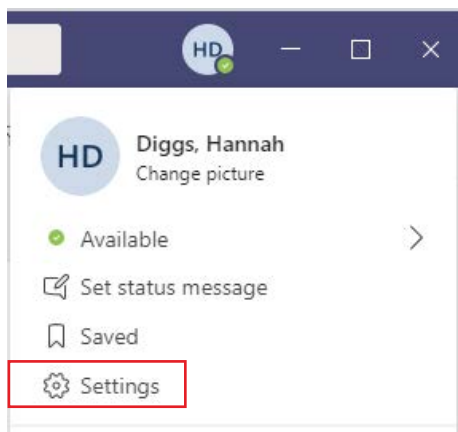


# Checking Hardware in Teams

1. To check your system hardware to ensure Teams will run correctly on your machine, click your user avatar.

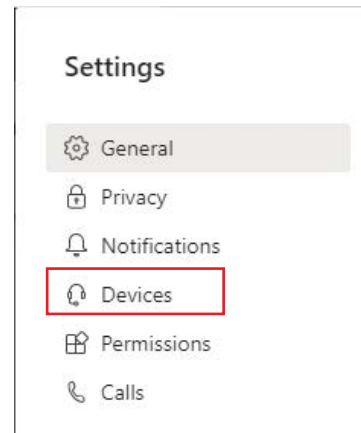


2. Then select "Settings."

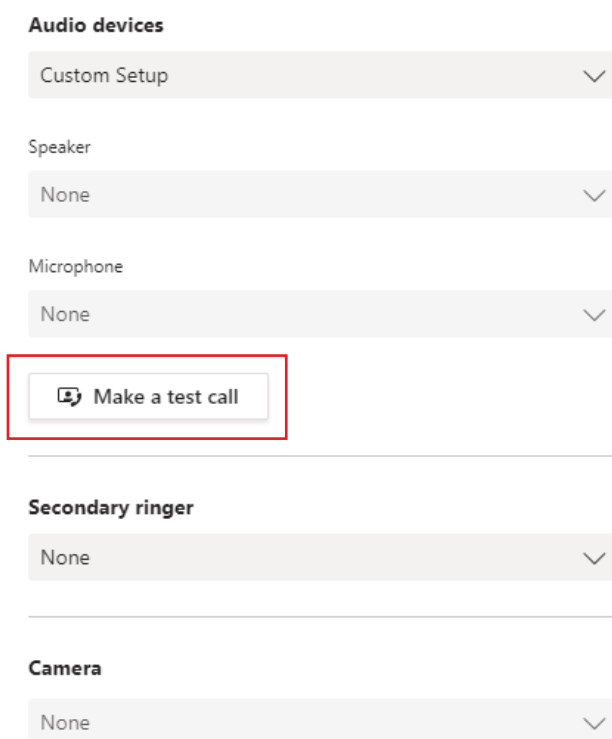


## Checking Your Hardware in Teams

3. Select **Devices** on the left hand menu.

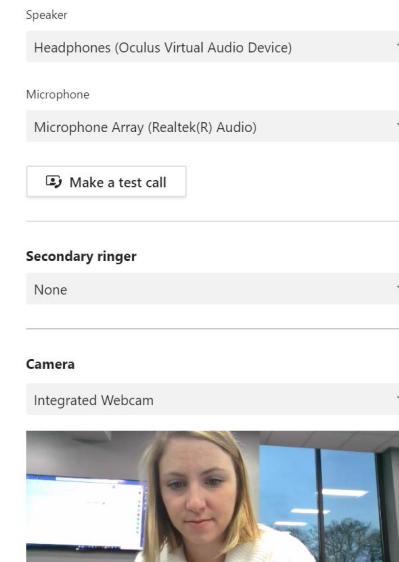


4. Select **Make a Test Call**.

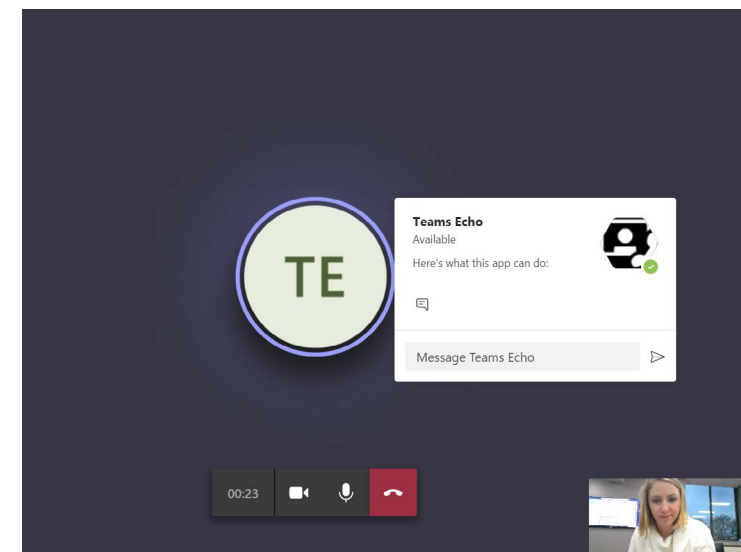
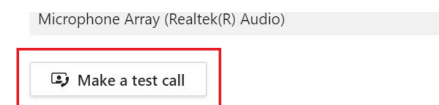


## Checking Your Hardware in Teams

4. Under devices, you should see all your hardware being checked. It should find your camera, microphone, and speaker.

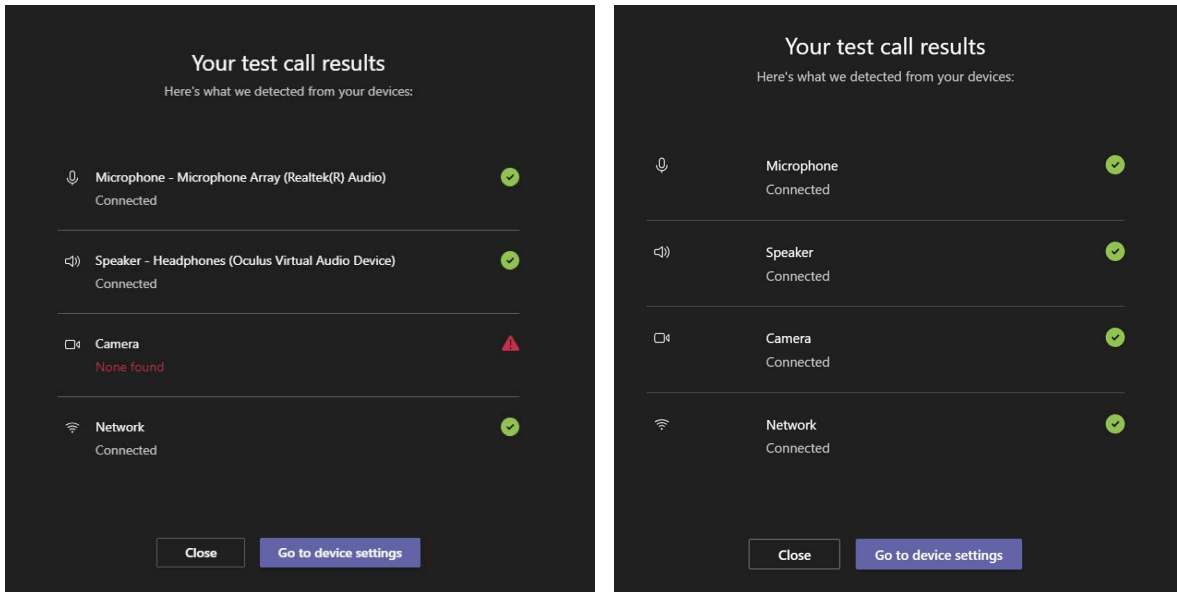


5. You can also make a test call. It should test your microphone, speaker, and webcam.

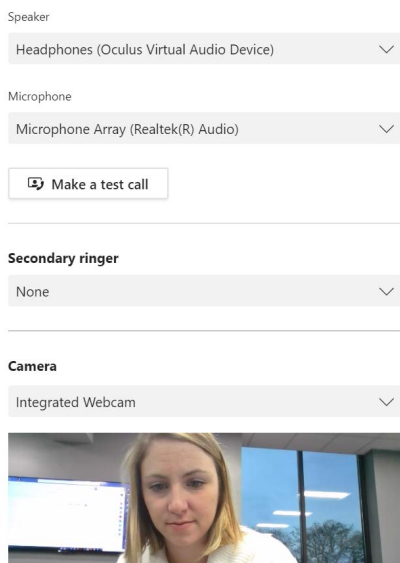


# Checking Your Hardware in Teams

6. After the call has ended, teams will give a popup that shows the test results.



7. If your hardware does not produce success, you can go to **Device Settings**, and choose the hardware that you would like to use. If your hardware still does not work, restart your computer. If that does not fix the issue, try updating your drivers.
